Minutes

April 1, 2024

Mayor Cox called the City Council meeting to order at 6:00 PM. Followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council members present Georgie Eggleston, Terry Tyler, Ricky Yeager, and Bryson Meats. There is still one vacant position on the council.

Mayor Cox asked for approval of the proposed agenda for April 1. Yeager moved to approve the agenda. Tyler seconded. The motion was approved 4/0.

Mayor Cox requested approval of the March 4 proposed City Council meeting minutes. Meats noted that the school bond vote is May 14 instead of May 4, as recorded in the minutes. By correcting the school bond vote, Tyler moved to accept the City Council minutes. Eggleston second, and the motion passed.

Mayor Cox asked for the approval of the warrants/bill presented with the proposed agenda. Tyler moved to accept the warrants presented with the agenda. Yeager second. Motion passed 4/0

Laurie Goracke updated the council on the summer ball program. She also asked if the City Council was responsible for paying the umpires and how much they would be paid per game.

Mayors Report:

Mayor Cox read Ordinance No.444, amending the fee for collecting solid waste. The new price per poly-cart is \$17.25, down from \$21.65. Any additional poly-cart costs \$7.00 monthly. The contract will increase 5% annually. Meats moved to accept Ordinance 444 as read by the Mayor, Tyler second. The motion passed 4/0.

Mayor Cox asked for a vote to pay for half of the Titan Rec's Director's yearly salary of \$750.00. Yeager moved, paying half of the Titan Rec payroll of \$750.00. Tyler second. Motion passed 4/0

Mayor Cox asked for a vote to donate to the SCC After Prom Party. Bryson moved to donate \$500.00 to the SCC After Prom Party, Yeager's second motion passed 4/0

Superintendent Report: Aaron Copeland updated the council on the options for dredging the sewer lagoons.

Parks The playground equipment needs some parts replaced. The steps are rusting through and leaving holes. Fixing the steps will cost \$2996.00. The council would like it taken care of as soon as possible and to order the new parts.

City Clerk's Report: Kim Alexander gave her a report. She has a meeting with Everbridge to gather information on mass texting. She can give the council more information on Everbridge at the next meeting.
