

LeRoy City Council

Minutes

November 7, 2022

Mayor Steve Cox called the meeting to order via telephone at 6:00 PM, followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Council members present, Georgie Eggleston, Rob McCann, Tim Harvey, and Terry Tyler. Jeff Brite was absent from the meeting.

Mayor Cox recommended approval of the proposed November 7th agenda. Tyler motioned to approve the agenda as stated. Eggleston's second motion passed 4/0.

Mayor Cox recommended the approval of the October 3 city council meeting minutes. McCann made a motion to approve the October 3rd minutes. Harvey seconded the movement, and the motion passed 4/0

Mayor Cox recommended that the city council pay warrants/bills provided with the proposed agenda. Tyler moved to approve the payment of the city warrants provided with the proposed agenda. McCann seconded the motion. The motion passed 4/0

Sara Stewart addressed the council about donating \$500.00 for the sign at the campus for LeRoy Gidley school system 245. Harvey motioned to donate the \$500.00 for the campus signs. McCann seconded the motion. The mayor asked for discussion and then called for a vote after some debate. The motion passed 3/1 with Eggleston Voting no.

Sara Stewart addressed the council about donating \$250.00 for Santa to hand out presents to the children on December 4th. McCann motioned to donate the \$250.00 to Love LeRoy for the Santa presents. Tyler seconded the motion passed 3/1 with Eggleston voting no.

Mayor Cox provided the council with the mayor's report. Mayor Cox recommended the council go into a 30-minute executive session for attorney-client privilege. McCann motioned to go into executive session for 30 minutes for attorney-client privilege. Tyler seconded the motion. The motion passed on 4/0, and the executive session started at 6:25 and returned to the regular session at 6:55, with no action being taken.

City Superintendent Copeland reported to the council.

City Clerk Alexander reported to the council.

McCann motioned to sell the police inventory plus the police car with the mayor first researching if there is any limitation of selling the items purchased with a grant. Harvey seconded the motion mayor called for a discussion and then called for a vote motion passed 4/0.

The mayor called for a vote for adjournment, and Tyler motioned to adjourn. McCann's second motion passed 4/0.
